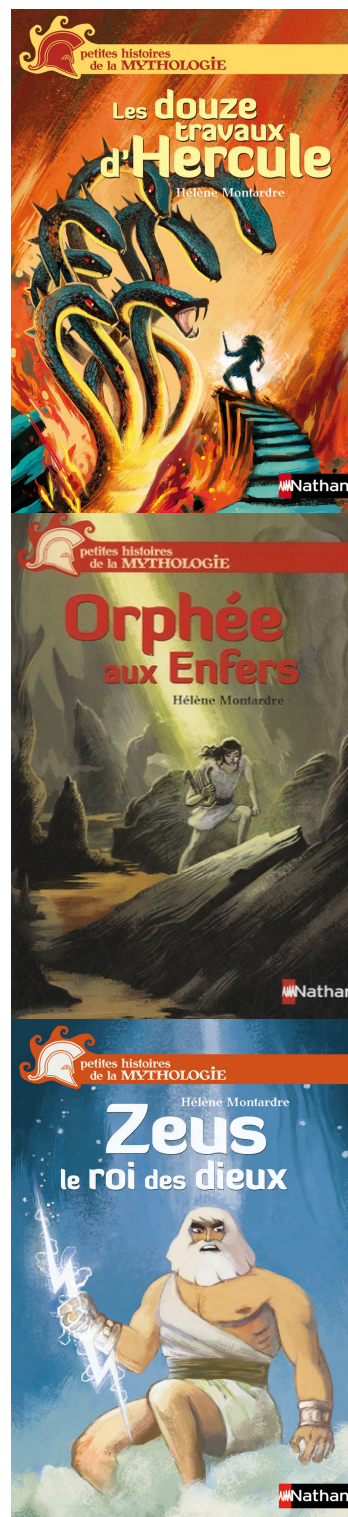

Born in 1954 in Montreuil, in a family with origins in the Forez Mountains. Because of her father's occupation (the writer Georges Montforez, 1921-1974), during her childhood and adolescence she frequently moved and lived in many different places: Saint-  tienne, Marvejols, Nantes, Loudun, Issoire. She studied English at the University of Clermont-Ferrand, where she obtained her PhD (*L'image des personnages f  minins dans la litt  rature de jeunesse fran  aise contemporaine de 1975    1995*. Lille: Presses universitaires du Septentrion) in 1999. For the last forty years or so, she has lived with her family in the Haute-Garonne, Occitanie. During the last decade, she wrote a number of books based on a variety of Greek myths, with illustrations by Nicolas Duffaut; the books appeared in two series published by Nathan and called: *Petites histoires de la mythologie* and *Contes et l  gendes jeunesse*.

She has written over fifty books, mainly for children and received many literary awards:

Summary

Five of the volumes of the series tell stories connected to Homer's *Iliad* and *Odyssey*: *The Beautiful Helen*, *Achilles the Warrior*, *In the Belly of the Trojan Horse*, *Odysseus and the Cyclops*, *The Monsters of the Odyssey*; five describe Olympian gods: [Zeus, King of the Gods](#), *The Abduction of Persephone*, *Hephaistos and the Love of Aphrodite*, *Apollo, the Dolphin God**, and *Hermes, the God of a Thousand Gifts*; eight volumes feature demi-gods, heroes and their stories: *Prometheus, the Thief of Fire*, *Perseus and the Gorgon*, [Twelve Labours of Heracles](#), *Theseus and the Minotaur*, *Jason and the Golden Fleece*, *Daedalus' Labyrinth*, [Orpheus in Hell](#), *Oedipus' Curse*; one volume focuses on a magical animal (*Pegasus, the Untameable*), and one on the Roman myth of the twin brothers and founders of Rome ([The Fight between Remus and Romulus](#)). At the end of each volume, a "Pour en savoir plus" section provides basic information about the presented myth's characters and sources.

* There is a play on words in the title *Apollon, le dieu dauphin*. Dolphins are Apollo's animals but he is also "le dauphin", the son of the King.

Analysis

Adaptations of well-known myths for primary school children (the publisher indicates the age of 9+ as the target) are presented as stand-alone, fascinating stories; pleasant reading for that age group. Expressive illustrations, even though they are only in black and white. The three selected stories are typical for this kind of children's series. There are practically no deviations from the canonical versions of the myths. Still, the manner, style, and language of the gentle narration align with the simple poetics of stories for young children and their specific educational purpose.

A didactic-cognitive aspect is present in the stories themselves and the final more encyclopedic section included in each book. A good balance maintained between the interesting, adventurous narrative and general mythological information. The series covers the best-known myths and individual volumes constituting a cohesive and representative collection of myths for young school children, who
